

ELLIOT BROWN WATCHES | CARE & MAINTENANCE

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Your watch is tough, but it's still assembled from precision components built to phenomenally tight tolerances, so try to avoid really hard impacts.

Washing your watch: Give it a rinse if (and when) it gets muddy or is used in salt water, to keep the moving components like the bezel working at their best, and then dry it off.

Maintenance of Leather Straps: As with anything made of decent leather, it's best not to get leather straps soaking wet too often – if your strap encounters regular moisture, it's best to swap it for rubber, webbing or a bracelet instead.

Using Tools: Using screwdrivers and strap bar tools. Always hold the tool between thumb and middle finger whilst applying pressure with your forefinger. Please don't hold tools in the palm of your hand.
